April is National Heart worm awareness month


"Many pet owners mistakenly think their dog or cat isn't at risk for heartworm because they don't live in what has been historically considered a heartworm endemic region of the country," said CAPC board member, Cassan Pulaski, DVM, MPH. "This is no longer the case. While southern regions of the country have historically been associated with heartworm, we now know pets all over the country are potentially at risk for heartworm disease throughout the year."

CAPC recommends monthly heartworm protection and annual testing for both heartworm antigens and microfilariae, regardless of where pets live or travel.

The drug to kill heart worm, Ivermectin, is not only killing heart worms, it also kills other worms. It is a great drug.

MAP IT OUT.

See how heartworm incidence rates in your area compare with the rest of the country.





An original drug, Avermectin, was modified to Ivermectin, which turned out to be highly effective in both animals and humans against a variety of parasites, including those that cause River Blindness and Lymphatic Filariasis. The discoverers of the drug were awarded the 2015 Nobel Prize in Physiology or Medicine.
