

Cloning of dogs

As you know, cloning is the production of genetically identical Individuals, i.e. a "clone" is a genetic twin born at a later date.

Now dog clones are made commercially. by the company ViaGen in Texas.

To clone a dog costs \$50,000.

If you have a dog you may want to clone in the future, you arrange to get a skin biopsy, and for \$1,600 the company will save it for when you decide to go ahead.


Do you have a favorite dog you may want to re-create in the future?
