Don't loose your Whippet while traveling

Whippets lost away from home are not always found. The ASPCA has interviewed over 1000 pet owners, and here are the conclusions for dogs:

14 % of dog owners lost their dog in the last five years

- 93 % of lost dogs were recovered
- 49% were found in the neighborhood
- 15% were recovered because they had an ID tag or microchip
- 6% were found at a shelter
