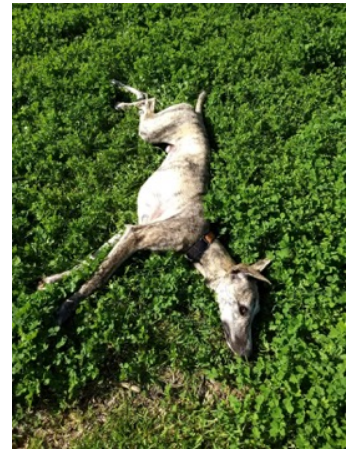


Race Car Puppy update:

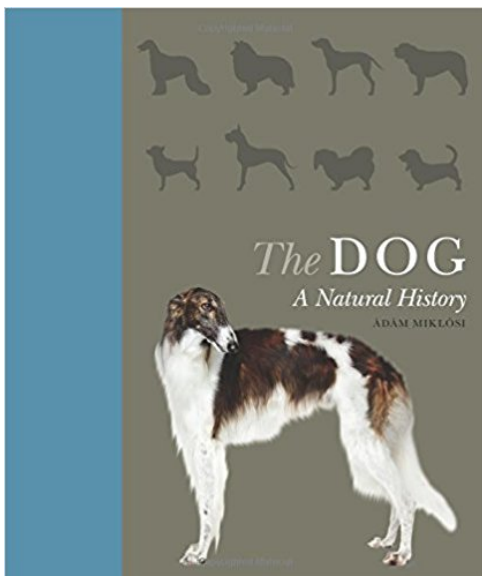


From the Saluki Center web site:
