## Fighting FOR Tooth and Nail!

As you know, teeth are the most commonly neglected part of dogs. Nails come next.

Deb Eldrege, D.V.M., writes in Canine Health: "Dental health and hygiene has been well established as important for the health of our dogs. Dental plaque has been correlated with heart and kidney problems in dogs as well as being potentially painful. The gold standard is brushing your dog's teeth every day."


So how about dental treats? Are they any good? A recent small study showed that one particular dental treat can help cut back on oral bacterial growth for 12 hours. So if brushing teeth is too much for you, give a dental treat twice a day.



Most dogs hate having their nails trimmed. Whippet nails grow fast and need trimming frequently. I use a grinder; I find it too risky to use a nail cutter. When my grandson Jakob was visiting recently, he came up with a new way of making nail trimming, easy on the dog and the trimmer. He would stand in front of the dog, treat in hand. The dog would concentrate on the treat, and I, the trimmer, could grind the nails more easily.
