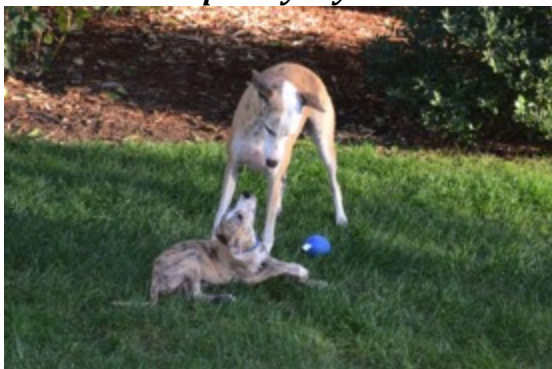

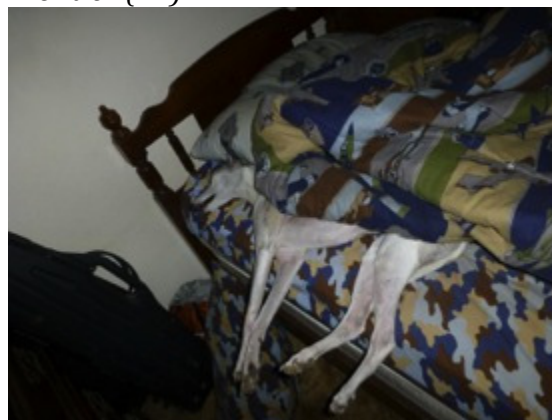

“He hates to get off the sofa. Even when I am out in the yard, he will look at me and cry by the door. “

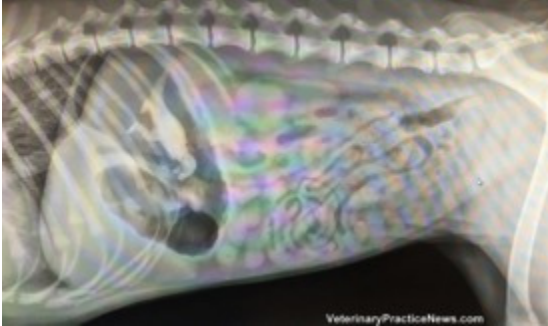

I liked this one. Surgery was not required to get it out.

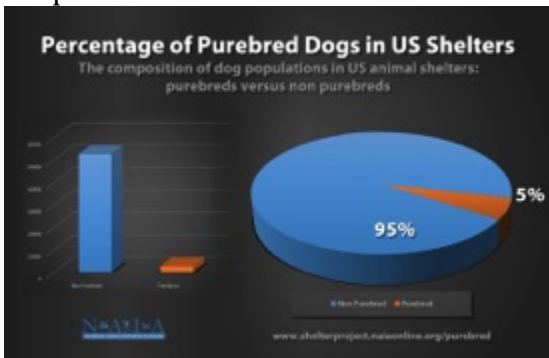


National Animal Interest Alliance
